Priority 1.

From the list of incidents that have been reported, I'm glad to say that there have been none for speeding over the May period.

Colleagues did speed efforcement along Morda Rd within the last month. I'm unaware of the results but hope that the sight of the speed board blaringly showing the cars speed reduced any speeders to withing the limit.

We have had a few reports of road traffic collisions. These have been on the fast A roads. Luckily no major injuries have occurred.

Priority 2.

There have been 5 reports of ASB.

Two were from the Maesbury area where neighbours have become exhasperated with tha actions of a neighbour who seems to think he has the right to do as he wishes. We are working in conjunction with SCC regarding his dumping of rubbish in a layby and lighting fires in it too. The fire brigade cam out to the fire and doused the flames before any damage was caused to the road surface.

Two reports are from Morda where a certain house is still causing issues for neighbours. The tenant is allowing local males to congregate, consum alcohol and then cause ASB, upsetting other tenants. Again we are working with our partner agencies in relation to the tenant having restrictions placed on her tenancy.

The last incident reported came from Llynclys wre a group of teenagers have been causing issues in the locality. I attended and spoke to the group and then went back with the housing officer to speak to the parent of the lead troublemaker. The tenant has been warned of her allowing her teenage son to cause issues to other tenants in the area and singed an undertaking letter.
