ALL CHANGE ON THE COUNCIL

At the September meeting the Council services for your area. co-opted Jeff Court as Councillor for the Trefonen and Treflach Ward. Jeff has lived in the area for many years and in Trefonen since 2006.

Planning

Since the adoption of Shropshire Council's Site Allocation and Management of Development Planning Policy, the Parish has seen a reduction in speculative planning applications which has caused a great deal of consternation and anger amongst parishioners. Even so, the Parish continues to receive a high number of applications for a variety of reasons.

Street lights: Both Shropshire Council and the Parish Council own lamps in the Parish. You can report a fault to Shropshire Council or the Clerk.

Litter picks

There have been some recent well publicised litter picks, for example for the Queen's 90th birthday in which groups around the parish took part. If residents wish to organise their own local litter pick, please let a Councillor or the Clerk know. The Council can arrange for the right equipment to be provided and also for the removal of the picked litter.

Oswestry Dial-a-Ride and Community Car Scheme

Oswestry Dial-a-Ride provides a valuable door to door transport service for people in our parish. All their mini-buses are fully accessible and can carry wheelchair users.

Dial-a-Ride provides transport for:

- people who have no access to public transport and with no frequent or convenient access to a car
- the elderly
- people with ill health
- people with disabilities
- wheelchair users

The service can provide opportunities for shopping, visiting family or friends, hospital and doctors appointments, hairdressers, post office and library. The fares range from $\pounds 1.50$ each way to $\pounds 5$ each way. To make a booking you can ring up to 6 days in advance, bookings cannot be made on the same day of travel.

The Community Car scheme allows travel further afield and operates Monday to Friday 9am — 5pm. The are a number of cars available and the journey is calculated on a per mile basis.

ORPC's Strategic Plan

One of the roles of a Parish Council is to understand what is important to residents, their lives and surroundings. In 2004 and 2014 questionnaires were sent to residents in the Parish to find out how the Parish should develop and improve.

The Council has compiled the results from these questionnaires together with other on-going requirements for the maintenance of existing infrastructure and assets into a Strategic Plan. The Plan directs the Council's actions and also the Financial Budget.

Between the months of October and January, the Council will be reviewing the Plan as it sets its Budget for 2017/18. Please take a look at the Plan on the Council's website. Is there anything we have missed? We also welcome your feedback on priorities for the coming financial year.

CALLING ALL COMMUNITY GROUPS

Every week different community groups gather together in one of the village halls, churches or public houses in the Parish. The Parish Council is wanting to identify all these groups for a variety of reasons, one being the grants and award schemes set out below but also should there be any important information the Council needs to quickly pass on, these groups are an ideal way of communicating with parishioners. If you are an organiser of a community group, please register your group with the Clerk as soon as possible.

Community Grants

Within this year's financial budget, the Parish Council put aside a small amount of funds to help local community groups. There is an agreed criteria and application form which can be obtained from the Clerk. Completed applications must be submitted by 31 December and will be considered at the January Parish Council meeting. All applications will be considered on their individual merits. The final decision on assessment of applications and the level of any grant offered lies with Oswestry Rural Parish Council.

Community Service Award

Advance notice that the Parish Council is re-introducing its Community Service Award in 2017. Now is the time to start thinking who you consider deserves to be recognised for their good works locally. The award will be presented to the person who is considered to have made a significant contribution to their local community Full details will be included in the February edition of Rural News.

🕀 🕀 Local Infrastructure 🕀 🖨

Over the last few years, local councils and builders/ developers have been coming to terms with Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL). You may not be aware of this new charge on new housing but you do have a say in how it is spent.

CIL is governed by national legislation with set criteria over its use and is managed locally by Shropshire Council. When CIL is collected the majority of the funds is allocated to the Parish where the new development takes place. There have been a number of new housing sites approved in recent times so the Parish will be able to utilise this new source of funding.

CIL can only be spent on infrastructure. This includes roads and other transport facilities, flood defences, schools and other educational facilities, medical facilities, sporting and recreational facilities and open spaces. Potential projects to be funded by CIL have to be identified in advance and agreed by Shropshire Council. This is where the Parish Council needs your help. What new infrastructure do you think would improve the Parish? With the increase of new homes, what existing facilities requires improvement/ replacement?

The Parish Council has already identified the following:

- Morda Village Hall refurbishment and expansion.
- Trefonen Village Hall improvements
- Trefarclawdd Cemetery improvements
- Street Light conversion to LED

Please discuss this with family and neighbours and pass on any thoughts to your local Parish Councillors or the Clerk. Contact details can be found on the back page.
