

Knockin & Kinnerley Cricket Club	The Pavilion, Kinnerley Road, Knockin, Oswestry	The Club was formed in 1862 and meets daily during the summer. 12 attendees are from the parish of Oswestry Rural.	"Following the launch of junior cricket in 2008 and the building of a new clubhouse in 2011, the club has grown exponentially in membership and participation. There are now 230 club members (up 240% since 2010), of which 149 are junior (aged 5-15) and 81 are senior (16 to 70). The club currently fields 4 weekend senior teams (2 in 2008), 2 midweek senior teams (1), 5 junior sides (0) and 3 ladies Softball teams (0). So we are desperately short of room, especially for ladies changing. Ladies cricket is currently one of the largest growth areas in sport. The cost of the project will be approximately £30,000." Whilst the group has equipment provided by Shropshire Council members use their own tools to trim hedges leading to personal loss and wear and tear. The Group would like to purchase a sturdy, but light, battery operated hedge cutter and spare battery that is more portable to allow greater efficiency.	Their work enables and ensures improved access of local rights of way for all who use them. The Group encourages walking which promotes health and well-being in the local area. Treflach and Trefonen P3 Group	The Group normally meets at a member's house in Treflach or Trefonen.	The Group was formed in 2014 and the main aims are to maintain the local rights of way in Treflach, Trefonen and Nantmawr. This includes installing new stiles, way markers, and strimming and hedge cutting along the footpaths and reporting rights of way issues to Shropshire Council.	This year is the 50th anniversary of the Offa's Dyke Association and they are looking to celebrate the occasion at various points along Offa's Dyke. The P3 Group have considered the creation of 2 artistic signs made out of Oak and glass to be placed along the route of the Dyke. It is hoped to have them in place in September 2019 so that they can be celebrated alongside other local events of which Trefonen will be one of the locations.
